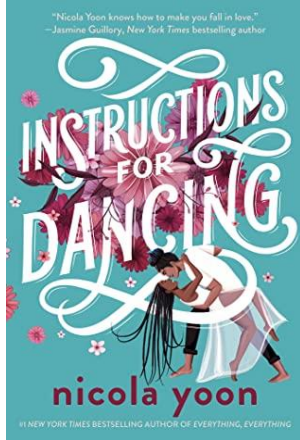

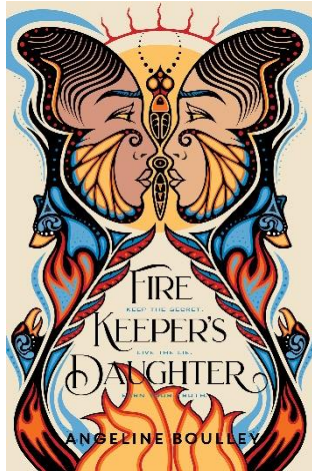
February Recommendation:

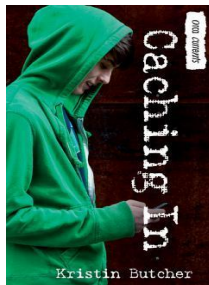
Indigenous Focus:



Firekeeper's Daughter by Angeline Boulley

This book has mature content as Daunis, the main character, becomes a confidential informant trying to uncover a meth ring. Things are not good in her town as people are dying and others are addicted to meth. She is recruited by the FBI to help them figure out who is making and distributing the drugs. When two people close to her are murdered, the FBI recruit her to be their eyes on the inside. Is anyone safe? How far will Daunis go to protect her community? She learns what it means to be a strong Anishinaabe woman.
