Let me start with an anxiety analogy.

I think of a pair of fraternal twin sisters. One of these sisters is named Conscientious, and the other is named Anxiety. Anxiety's given name at birth was Fear, but she decided it was too common, and Anxiety

sounded sassier.

These two sisters are adults, and they are parents of teenagers.

#### Now here is the particular scenario.

These sisters, who live together, enter their living room, where each of their teens is sitting on the couch. The teens were supposed to be setting the table for dinner.

The sisters have been calling the teens from the kitchen to come and help them to no avail.

When the two sisters get to the living room, a decision has to be made. Will Conscientious handle the situation, or will Anxiety?

Conscientious is gifted in being able to see situations from many perspectives and clever in being able to think through different scenarios before acting.

Anxiety, on the other hand, is singularly focused — laser-like. **Anxiety approaches situations reflexively.** 

The question these two sisters must decide at that doorway is who will step over the line into the room and attend to this situation with the teens, Consciousness or Anxiety?

When Anxiety takes the lead, this can be a real problem. First of all, **she is contagious, so others absorb her negativity. Another issue is she is not very effective.** She gets the job done in the short run but rarely has made real progress toward lasting change.

## Grade 9 Vaccinations ~ Feb 9 catch up date 8:30-10:30

Parents/Legal Guardians of the Grade 9 students will be receiving a phone call late December to early January to obtain consent for students routine Immunizations; **TDAP vaccine** which protects against 3 diseases; Tetanus, Diphtheria and Pertussis (whooping cough) **Meningococcal quadrivalent vaccine**. This vaccine protects against infections from 4 types of meningococcal bacteria. Primary Care Nurses will be coming to the school at the end of January - dates TBA to administer immunizations. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact the Community Health Unit at 250-983-6850.

## Students will <u>NOT</u> be offered COVID-19 vaccines during these clinics.

QJS does not have any documentation or any of the information here. We are only the site for administering vaccinations. Northern Health nurses will contact you and, you can provide or withdraw any permissions.

At school, we provide the opportunity for convenience (for families/individuals who wish onsite vaccinations). Families are also able to take their members to the Community Health Center instead of having vaccinations at the school.
